DAY 1 – OCTOBER 31, 2011- ARRIVE AT LOS ANGELES INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (-/-)

Arrive at Los Angeles International Airport at 11:40 pm. Please arrive airport 3 hours prior to departure. Check in at Air China counter.

DAY 2 – NOVEMBER 1, 2011- DEPART LOS ANGELES TO BEIJING (-/-)

Depart from Los Angeles to Beijing via Air China Flight CA 984 at 01:40 am. Cross the International dateline.

DAY 3 – NOVEMBER 2, 2011- ARR. BEIJING (-/L/D)

Welcome to Beijing, the capital of China. Arrive in Beijing at 5:30 am. Meet and greet by Asia Getaway bi-lingual staff.

Introduction briefing of China. You begin the program by visiting the **Temple of Heaven**, where the emperors prayed to the heaven for a good harvest. Afternoon, you are free at your leisure or join the *optional Hutong tour* to see the Old Beijing. This is now the special preserved area in the city. You will get on a rickshaw and ride in the small alley of Beijing. Tonight, enjoy a welcome dinner at a local restaurant.

Overnight at Beijing Marriott City Wall Hotel or similar for 3 nights

DAY 4 – NOVEMBER 3, 2011- BEIJING (B/L/D)

This morning, visit **Summer Palace**, ancient royal resort built by the Dragon lady in the last dynasty. Afternoon, visit the largest square in the world - **Tiananmen Square** and **Forbidden City**, the imperial palace. Great spot to take the Group picture to memorize the trip. OPTIONAL TOURS (Minimum 10 pax)

1. Hutong Tour in Beijing

Hutong is a traditional living area for ordinary Beijing citizens, the history of which dates back to 1000 years ago. Hundreds of thousands of houses of traditional architecture style are densely flanked on both sides of narrow and zigzag streets in which people have been living a peaceful and traditional life there through many generations. Tourists will first get on traditional rickshaw, two for each, for a Hutong tour, riding through those narrow streets tracing the taste of the historical life of an oriental country. During the two hours Hutong tour tourists will learn a lot of China's modern life and its people. It is another highlight after the Great Wall.

2. The Legend of Kung Fu

The Legend of Kung Fu is a production, which combines the elements of kung fu, story telling, acrobatics, modern dance and original music to celebrate the philosophy and skill of martial arts. The show tells the story of a young boy, Chun Yi (the pure one), whom in order to pursue spiritual and physical harmony is apprenticed as a monk to learn kung fu.

3. Traditional Chinese reflexology

Experience the traditional Chinese reflexology. The ancient art of healing by working pressure points on the feet corresponding to different parts of the body. It is believed that following illness, injury or stress, the vital energy pathways in the body are blocked preventing the body from functioning normally. Chinese reflexology helps unblock these pathways by ridding the body of toxins and improving blood circulation. This restores the body's equilibrium, encourages healing and strengthens the body.

4. Acrobatic Show

Acrobatics is an interactive art form. Everyone, young or old, educated or not, can easily appreciate it while watching or seeing the acrobats perform. There is no language barrier and borders of culture do not limit it. Since its foundation in 1951, Shanghai Acrobatic Troupe has grown into a world-class circus and acrobatic troupe of high reputation with its well-trained cast of super talents plus its full range of programs. What makes the troupe proud is that it has won numerous top awards both in national and international circus competitions such as China National Acrobatic Competition, Festival Mondial du Cirque Demain in Paris and the International Circus Festival in Monte Carlo. Moreover, it has enjoyed popularity over the past years when making more than 100 tours in U.S.A., Canada, Germany, Spain, Australia, Malaysia, Thailand, Korea, Japan, Singapore, Indonesia, etc.

5. Fengjing Ancient Watertown

Fengjing is an ancient watertown. Walking along the old street in the watertown, you will see many bridges and rivers. Enjoy the beautiful and natural scenery of this small town. You will also visit the Old Street Long Corridor, the ancient drama stage.

6. Shanghai Maglev Train

Shanghai maglev train, the first commercial rail line of its type in the world, at top speed of 431 kilometers per-hour which is much faster than the Bullet Train in Japan. Shanghai Maglev Train takes only 7 minutes and 20 seconds to cover 30-kilometer trip, which currently takes 30 to 40 minutes by driving. Invested with a total amount of 10 billion yuan, it took 2.5 years to complete. Powered by electromagnetism, when running it is suspended in air, about 10 millimeters above the track on a magnetic cushion. It brings a speed revolution to the world in ground transportation, and riding on the train will be an exciting experience for you!

Best Buy in China: Shopping with famous Chinese Art & Crafts

Jade Factory

China is rich in its jade resource, therefore jade and its cultural impact to Chinese people and later on to Asians has been historical. Tourists will get a chance to visit Beijing Jade Carving Factory, which so far is the biggest jade collection in China. Tourists will find Hundreds of thousands of precious jade, jadeites and handmade jade carvings, the raw material of which come from Northeast and Silk road area of China.

Pearl Farm

The Pearl shop in Beijing has been exhibiting a rich variety of home produced sea pearls and fresh water pearls due to both the historical reason and the modern market. Among them, the king and queen size pearls are really of precious quality. The type of Pearl Powder on sale was first contributed to Qing Dynasty Royal Family as a cosmetic and they can be found here too.

Cloisonne Factory

Born in Beijing 300 years ago, cloisonné is the kind of handmade arts and crafts article used a great deal by royal family and rich families in the past. Now it is popular to every body. Tourists will take a chance to visit the workshop seeing how the beautiful articles been made with their own eyes. The gorgeous design, hand-made workmanship and tremendous types make cloisonné articles really attractive to both domestic and overseas tourists.

Tea Plantation

Longjing Tea (Dragon Well Tea) is one of China's best teas and is one reason for Hangzhou's international fame. The tea is grown in the Longjing mountain area of Hangzhou, southwest of the West Lake. The flat and smooth tealeaves brew a tea with light to dark green color, a fragrant scent, and a refreshing taste. The place is frequently visited by those who come for a taste of the Longjing tea, well noted for its greenness, fragrance, mellow taste, and beauty of tealeaves. Longjing Tea is on the top list of the 10 most famous green teas in China. Tea terraces rise up on either side of the village and it's an interesting area to walk around and watch the locals at work.

Silk Workshop

Textiles have a very long history in China, as garments, currency, tax goods, and commodities. Chinese domesticated silkworms no later than 3,000 BCE, but archaeologists have discovered cocoons at Neolithic sites. The ancient Chinese also wove ramie and hemp, which were worn by the common people. Nowadays, silk production is still one of the important parts of the people's life.

In the Silk Museum, you will have a chance to see the complete process of making silk from silkworms, you even can see the old silk weaving machines, hand-making silk quilt.
