In 1806, the Little River Turnpike Company opened 34 miles of 'paved' road for traffic from Alexandria to the banks of the Little River. It is at the end of the Turnpike that Aldie's history begins.

Come celebrate history as you cross the original Stone Bridge that people have used for more than 200 years.

Directions: West on Route 50 (John Mosby Hwy.) into Loudoun County towards Middleburg. Go 1 mile west of Gilbert's Corner traffic circle (Intersection of Rt. 15 and Rt. 50).
